Labin	Protection / Maintenance	Acquisition of this 5.76-acre property provides an open-space buffer between the Route 72 West Associates property and nearby residential development along the Route 72 corridor. Nearly all property located throughout this corridor remains under considerable threat from development.	Forest / Woodland	5.76	0.00
Little Egg Harbor - Wells Island	Protection / Maintenance	Acquisition of this property protects valuable forested upland and adjoining emergent tidal wetland habitats for migratory birds and other wildlife in an area under tremendous development pressure.	Forest / Woodland	85.00	0.00
Margaret Major Haines Tract	Protection / Maintenance	Acquisition of this 400-acre property within a designated Natural Heritage Priority Area includes several known and suspected sites inhabited by federally-listed and/or state-listed endangered and threatened species.	Freshwater Marsh	400.00	0.00
M.K. Hanna Tract	Protection / Maintenance	Acquisition of this property protects critical habitat for migratory birds and provides potentially important open space for bird watching, hiking and other recreational activities.	Tidal Wetland	98.00	0.00
Potter's Creek	Protection / Maintenance	This ecologically important wetland site was acquired due to its location within the Trust for Public Land's Century Plan to protect and conserve the natural landscape and resources of the Barneгат Bay ecosystem.	Tidal Wetland	118.00	0.00
Route 72 Campbell Property	Protection / Maintenance	Acquisition of this 369-acre forest provides for a large, contiguous area of open space. The site adjoins a 200-acre site recently acquired by Ocean County and the 15,800-acre Stafford Forge Wildlife Management Area, which is managed by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection).	Forest / Woodland	369.04	0.00
Route 72 West Associates	Protection / Maintenance	Approximately 21.5 acres was acquired and an additional 37 acres was donated. The project protects wetlands and uplands along an intensively developed corridor (Rt. 72) in an area likely to experience additional development.	Forest / Woodland	58.50	0.00
Sands Point	Restoration / Rehabilitation	This project used herbicides to control the invasive form of common reed, then replanted the site with a mix of native grasses and other plant species.	Tidal Wetland	101.00	101.00
Tuckerton Lake	Protection / Maintenance	This acquisition expands the county's landholding and prevents development around portions of Tuckerton Lake, portions of which are included in the Tip Seaman County park.	Forested Wetland	28.70	0.00
