The design included a dike breach, and the installation of 5 large culverts and improve salmonid access to 10 miles of backwater slough.	Riparian		10
Hogan Ranch	Protection/Maintenance	The Scappoose Bay Watershed Council worked with numerous partners to address impacts of cattle farming on riparian areas of valuable salmonid habitat. The project including a permanent conservation of 173 acres in the Wetlands Reserve Program, fencing to protect the riparian areas from cattle migration, and a grazing management plan to reduce the influx of fecal coliform into fish rearing streams. "Kerr Property, Walluski River"	Protection/Maintenance	The Columbia Land Trust preserved a 35-acre property within the floodplain of the Walluski River. Planning is in progress for future reconnection of this and the adjacent property to tidal fluctuation by breaching the surrounding dike.	Riparian	35	
Malarkey Ranch	Reestablishment	The Scappoose Bay Watershed Council worked with a local landowner to replace two culvert barriers to fish passage with fish-friendly bridges. The culverts were identified in a preliminary assessment and prioritization of culverts in the Scappoose Bay watershed needing removal.	Riparian		3
Sandy River Delta	Enhancement	Ash Creek Forest Management has completed 110 acres of site preparation and revegetation-this phase is part of a multi-year restoration of floodplain and forest wetland habitat on the 1500 acre site.	Riparian	110	
Smith and Bybee Lakes	Enhancement	The City of Portland Environmental Services and Portland METRO worked to remove invasive species and plant natives in Smith and Bybee Lakes.	Riparian	22	
Walker Island	Protection/Maintenance	Conservation lease for 50 years (\$1 per year) to preserve valuable sensitive habitat from development within the Columbia River mainstem.	Riparian	109	
Woods Landing	Protection/Maintenance	Columbia Springs Education Center acquired one parcel to result in a total of 7 acres of conserved floodplain. Other activities have included revegetation.	Riparian	12
